58 **OPENING PRAYER AND DECLARATION OF QUORUM**

59 The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a. m. CDT. The Moderator shared comments by Cynthia  
60 Bolbach, moderator of the PC(USA). Anne Veldhuisen offered the opening prayer. The  
61 Moderator noted that a quorum was present. **The docket was presented and adopted.**

62 Several items from Council were included in the Consent Agenda and were **approved**. These  
63 included:

- 64 • Motion A: Approval of Transitional Position Description (24 April – 11 September 2012)  
65 for Jean Silva
- 66 • Motion B: Approval of revision of Chapter XV (Performance Reviews) of the Personnel  
67 Policies of the Presbytery of Florida
- 68 • Motion C: Approval of revision of Chapter VI (Work Week) of the Personnel Policies of  
69 the Presbytery of Florida
- 70 • Motion D: Approve the following recommendation –  
71 The Council endorses the Disaster Assistance Coordinator’s request that Presbytery  
72 approve the formation of an Administrative Commission composed of seven to nine  
73 people (one appointed by the Moderator) to serve as a Response Team for natural  
74 disasters and to coordinate with FLAPDAN the quick dispensing of relief funds from  
75 PDA.
- 76 • Motion E: Approved the following motion:

77 The Dogwood Acres Operations Committee seeks assistance in the promotion of the need  
78 for Presbytery member churches and groups to aid in funding the purchase of a used farm  
79 tractor and several implements that are necessary for the increased maintenance of the  
80 camp property. Currently, \$15,000 has been donated specifically for this purchase, an  
81 amount which the Committee estimates is about 50 percent of the total funds necessary.  
82 • Motion F: Approved the following motion:  
83 That Council encourage special gifts be given to the DWA's Tractor Fund, and that the  
84 expenditure of the \$30,000.00, when raised, be approved now

85 Greetings and welcome from Rev. Hugh Hamilton, Trinity Presbyterian Church, were received.

86 Visiting ministers and corresponding members were introduced. First-time elders were  
87 introduced.

88 Huw Christopher was called forward and presented a moderator's cross in thanksgiving for his  
89 time as moderator of the Presbytery of Florida.

90 A sharing of "good news" from our congregations was held. Churches which have good news to  
91 share are encouraged to let Jean Norman know so it can be included in future meetings of  
92 Presbytery. Hugh Hamilton shared news of the Acts 16:5 programs and the change in the  
93 congregation as a result.

94 Opening worship was held led by Commissioned Ruling Elder Jo Kublik. During worship, John  
95 Schuler was commissioned as Ruling Elder serving Navarre Presbyterian Church. Also  
96 commissioned were Hugh Hamilton, Henry Goode, Randy Jackson, and Monti Campbell as  
97 commissioners and alternates to the 220<sup>th</sup> General Assembly.

98 Clark Simmons, of the Board of Pensions, gave a brief presentation. Churches are encouraged to  
99 go to the pension website ([pensions.org](http://pensions.org)) to see ways for the church to save money.

100 The Committee on Preparation for Ministry received Linda Pitts as an Inquirer; she is at Union  
101 Theological Seminary studying for the MACE degree.

102 Brant Copeland, on behalf of the Committee on Preparation for Ministry, presented Glenn  
103 Hodges for examination for candidacy. Glenn shared his experience with grace and his  
104 understanding of his sense of call. He will receive his MDiv degree in May 2012 from Dubuque  
105 Theological Seminary. There were no questions from the floor; Brant moved that the  
106 examination be sustained and Glenn Hodges be moved to the roll of candidates. This was  
107 seconded and **approved**. Brant gave the charge to Glenn.

108 **Presbytery staff presented their reports.**

109 **Transitional Executive Presbyter Sally Hinchman.**

110 **Jean Silva presented the report of the AEP for Church Development and Education**  
111 **and Hunger Action Enabler.** She highlighted a "Feasting on the Word" workshop on

112 May 3 at Chipley. Also coming up is a workshop on Church Leadership on May 18-19.  
113 The next Two Cents a Meal grant application deadline is May 15.

114 **Kevin Veldhuisen presented the report of the AEP for Outdoor Ministry and**  
115 **Spiritual Development.** Male counselors are still needed for the summer camp program.

116 The Stated Clerk presented several reports.

- 117 • Presbytery Attendance for 2011. There were two called meetings and four stated  
118 meetings during 2011.
- 119 • 2011 Session Records Review. As of March 3, 2012, 19 churches have had their records  
120 for 2011 reviewed, leaving 26 churches still needing to submit their records for review.
- 121 • Annual Report on Christian Educators. The report shows that Lisa Wilder and Christy  
122 Williams will have voice at Presbytery meetings (per Manual of Operations, section 3,  
123 paragraph 5); 7 have voice and vote: Patty Arnett, Jeannie Dixon, Carol Deloach,

164 • Minutes of the Synod of South Atlantic stated meeting, March 8-9, 2012

165 **The report of the Treasurer was received as information.** The report for the month  
166 ending 03/31/2012 was included in the supplemental packet. March 31 reserve was  
167 \$332,394 (up from previous reports; \$241,553 in March 2011). Per capita has not been  
168 completely received; churches paying it quarterly were asked to inform the Presbytery  
169 bookkeeper.. Jim provided information on Dogwood Acres finances, reviewing the years  
170 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

171 Andy Jackson, chair of the **Budget, Finance and Stewardship Committee**, presented a  
172 document on incorporating a church. This is a new requirement of the PC(USA)  
173 constitution. Committee members are available to help any church wishing to  
174 incorporate.

175 A recent survey from the committee has received a 50% response, thus far; all churches  
176 are encouraged to submit responses to the survey.

## 177 **PRESBYTERY REPORTS**

178 The following reports were received as information:

179 **Disaster Assistance Coordinator.** The team will be forming a group to work with the  
180 Presbytery in the event of a disaster.

181 **Presbyterian Women** Moderator Jean Norman congratulated incoming PW Moderator Sherl  
182 Morden for her award as the National Association of Social Workers Public Citizen of the  
183 Year. Sherl received the award on the local, state and national levels for her work, in a  
184 volunteer capacity, as director of Second Chance of Northwest Florida. The non-profit  
185 organization serves brain-injury survivors and their families. PW is looking forward to the  
186 June gathering in Orlando; everyone is encouraged to sign up for the gathering.

187 **Self Development of People** Henry Goode reported SDOP is waiting to be recertified and is  
188 working with staff in Louisville for this.

## 189 **Church Development and Evangelism**

### 190 **Mission for Spiritual Development –**

191 **Youth:** Applications to serve on Youth Council will be available on the Presbytery website  
192 soon; youth are encouraged to apply and should meet with their session first; churches can  
193 have up to three on the council; the application deadline is June 5, 2012.

194 **Children:** Children’s Day at DWA was wonderful; a lesson on Pentecost is available today

195 **Training and Retreats:** Planning for 2013 Disciplefest will begin in May; it will be held  
196 separate from the January presbytery meeting.

197 **Council:** Tom Borland reported that the request from the office relocation committee for funds  
198 will be postponed until the August meeting of the Council.

199 It was noted that the commissioner forms to presbytery now only require either the session  
200 moderator or session clerk signature but not both.

201 **Personnel:** All action items were in the consent agenda and approved. The recent annual  
202 evaluations of the staff were a joy to hold and thanks given for our wonderful staff.

### 203 **Special Committee on Presbytery Office Relocation**

204 Mary Vance presented the report of the special committee. The committee did a lot of work  
205 and investigation and came to the point where it realized the best option is to relocate the  
206 office to DWA. But having no budget, they cannot continue, so everything is on hold until  
207 the August meeting of council.

### 208 **Mission for Dogwood Acres**

209 Ben Powell reported on activities to upgrade the camp. Everyone is encouraged to visit the  
210 camp and to volunteer at the camp. Ben presented information on an Annual Fund; the goal  
211 for this year is \$12,000.

212 Chris Erde presented the report of the **Nominating Committee**. The following nominations

238 **Mission for Spiritual Development Chair**

239 **Committee on Representation** – one member, Class of 2013

240 Stephen Yates, on behalf of the **Bills and Overtures Committee**, presented a resolution from  
241 the Session of First Presbyterian Church, Tallahassee:

242 The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Tallahassee, Florida calls upon the Presbytery of  
243 Florida to take the following actions:

- 244 1. Endorse the Coalition of Immokalee Workers' Campaign for Fair Food and commend it to the  
245 churches of Florida Presbytery.
- 246 2. Urge Florida-based Publix Supermarket to join the Fair Food Program.
- 247 3. Direct the Stated Clerk of the Florida Presbytery to write a letter to the Publix Corporation  
248 expressing support for the Campaign for Fair Food and urging Publix to join the Fair Food  
249 Program.
- 250 4. Urge the churches of Florida Presbytery to support the Campaign for Fair Food by
  - 251 • giving generously to the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering, which supports efforts to  
252 end hunger all over the world, including the United States. (In 2011 the One Great Hour  
253 of Sharing granted Interfaith Action of Southwest Florida \$14,000 to work in partnership  
254 with the Coalition of Immokalee Workers.)
  - 255 • participating in the Faith Moves Mountains spiritual campaign initiated by Florida clergy  
256 ([www.interfaithact.org/faithmovesmountains](http://www.interfaithact.org/faithmovesmountains) ).
  - 257 • sending postcards, letters and emails to the CEO of Publix, Mr. Ed Crenshaw (materials  
258 and information available on [www.pcusa.org/fairfood](http://www.pcusa.org/fairfood) )
  - 259 • dropping off manager's letters when they shop at Publix. These letters urge the company  
260 to work with the CIW and join the Fair Food Program. Letters are available for download  
261 at [www.pcusa.org/fairfood](http://www.pcusa.org/fairfood) (take action tab)
  - 262 • participating in peaceful acts of public witness with the CIW and with other supporters of  
263 the Campaign for Fair Food such as marches, rallies, and press conferences.

264 adopted by the Session, 1<sup>st</sup> Presbyterian, Tallahassee, April 1, 2012

265 Discussion of the resolution was held on the floor.

266 The motion on the floor is to support the above request from the Session of 1<sup>st</sup> Presbyterian  
267 Church, Tallahassee, FL.

268 Keith Posehn made a motion to postpone the vote until the next stated meeting. This was  
269 seconded, and a voice vote resulted in a divided house. A count resulted in a vote of 36 to  
270 postpone and 38 to not postpone. The motion failed.

271 The original motion carried 41 to 32.

272 Mark Broadhead presented the report for the **Committee on Ministry**.

273 The COM requests that Presbytery grant the status of Honorably Retired to Rev. Huw  
274 Christopher effective August 1, 2012, at the behest of Rev. Christopher.

275 Thanks were given to Huw and his wife, Rachel, for their service. Brant Copeland quickly  
276 composed and sang a hymn of thanks to Huw (from “Guide me O Thou Great Jehovah”). Huw  
277 gave his appreciation to the Presbytery for welcoming him and Rachel and supporting them in  
278 their ministry here.

279 Joan Wooten dismissed the group with prayer for lunch with the small groups to convene at 1:00.

280 The meeting was reconvened at 2:00. Sally Hinchman and the members of the transition team  
281 shared information from the break out groups. Sally will compile the notes from each small  
282 group.

283 Chris Erde for the Nominating Committee nominated Ben Lynch to the Youth Committee, Class  
284 of 2013, and Hailey Lynch to the Church Development and Evangelism Committee, Class of  
285 2012. This was **approved**.

286 Mark Broadhead continued with the report from the Committee for Ministry. The COM requests  
287 Presbytery approve the withdrawal of the Guidelines for Addressing Conflict Situations  
288 Including Churches Seeking Withdrawal. He noted that the Presbytery needs to adopt a  
289 “Gracious Dismissal” policy; by withdrawing this document, time could be given to the creation  
290 of the Gracious Dismissal policy. **This was approved.**

291 On April 20, 2012, the Stated Clerk received a letter from the session of Covenant Presbyterian  
292 Church, Tallahassee, FL, seeking dismissal from the denomination. The COM moved that an  
293 Administrative Commission be formed to address the request, and that it be composed of the  
294 following: Mary Vance (TE – Fellowship, Tallahassee), Beth House (RE – Christ, Tallahassee),  
295 Chris Erde (TE – 1<sup>st</sup>, Quincy), Bob Crabtree (RE – Christ, Tallahassee), Bill Bess (TE – 1<sup>st</sup>,  
296 Havana), Joan Custis (RE – 1<sup>st</sup>, Tallahassee). The AC shall have the power to:

297       • seek reconciliation with the session and the congregation on behalf of the Presbytery;



- 298 • review the discernment process engaged in by the church and to ascertain if there are any  
299 members of the congregation who wish to remain in the PC(USA);  
300 • call congregational gatherings to discuss the various issues related to dismissal and to  
301 establish, in conjunction with the session, a method for evaluating the congregation's  
302 desire to leave;  
303 • negotiate terms of dismissal with the session if deemed appropriate, which shall be  
304 brought to the Presbytery for its approval;  
305 • review the financial status of the congregation as part of the negotiation process;  
306 • request additional powers from the Presbytery it might deem necessary.

307 Discussion on the floor followed. The motion was **approved** unanimously on voice vote.  
308 Stephen Yates will be staff to the Administrative Commission; the AC will elect a chair. The AC  
309 will report back to Presbytery with their recommendation of action; only Presbytery can dismiss  
310 a congregation, if that be the outcome. Prayers are asked for the AC and the congregation of  
311 Covenant Presbyterian during this difficult time.


312 Ruth Mashewske asked for a moment to offer a prayer.

313 The next meeting will be at First Presbyterian, Quincy, on September 11, 2012.


314 There was no other business before the body. Rev. Chris Erde offered a closing prayer.
